Proposal from Canada to amend Sc5 Rule 3.1.3.2(b):

A performance record, other than an Altitude/Fall (3.3.7) Record, must be evaluated and certified by either the number of Judges as per Competition Rules where appropriate or by three Judges, two of whom must be FAI Skydiving Judges and the third Judge may be an FAI Skydiving Judge or a National Judge with a valid rating in the appropriate discipline (6.1). At least one of the FAI Skydiving Judges must be physically present on the location of the record. If performance records require the same judging equipment, measuring and scoring system(s) as competition records then 4.3.1.1 is applicable.

The line in red strikethrough was added in 2025. However, this rule has hindered the ability to attempt World Records rather than help facilitate them. Some countries do not have FAI judges readily available for onsite supervision of an attempted record. This leads to either:

- 1. a World Record attempt being abandoned or
- 2. an additional (large) expense to the organizer/athletes in order to fly an FAI judge in from another country, if one can be found. (i.e. flying a judge from Europe to Brazil).

Canada proposes the following change (although we are open to other suggested wording):

A performance record, other than an Altitude/Fall (3.3.7) Record, must be evaluated and certified by either the number of Judges as per Competition Rules where appropriate or by three Judges, two of whom must be FAI Skydiving Judges and the third Judge may be an FAI Skydiving Judge or a National Judge with a valid rating in the appropriate discipline (6.1). At least one of the FAI Skydiving Judges—these required Judges must be physically present on the location of the record. If performance records require the same judging equipment, measuring and scoring system(s) as competition records then 4.3.1.1 is applicable.
